Adjudicator's Reasons

1. Mr J [REDACTED] states that a number of people drive his car. He does not know who the driver was on 21st November. The appellant argues that there was no intentional littering but that there may have been accidental loss possibly of a doll bag which his younger sister lost.
2. The council argues that the three photographs it has provided shows that the contravention occurred. The Notice of Rejection refers to CCTV footage but this has not been uploaded.
3. The first photograph is timed at 21:04:59. It shows the pavement with no item on the pavement and no parked vehicle. The second photograph is timed at 21:18:44. This shows the appellant's car parked with a passenger door open. The final photograph is timed at 21:23:26. It shows the car being driven away and an object on the footway at the location where the car door had been opened.
4. Mr J [REDACTED] does not dispute that an item may have come out of his car but he argues that this was accidental when the car door was opened.
5. The contravention occurs if litter is thrown down, dropped or otherwise deposited from a vehicle. The enforcement authority does not have to establish that there was any intentional littering nor does an enforcement authority have to state what the item was that was littered.
6. Notwithstanding the time gap between the first and second photograph provided by the council I find, on the balance of probabilities, that the contravention occurred. The appellant accepts that an item came out of his car.
7. I dismiss this appeal.
